You're welcome to stop by as well!

When: Community Coffee Hour will be held on the third Thursday of each month from 1:00pm to 2:00pm. This is an informal, open-house style meeting so you can come for the whole time to meet people and chat, or just stop in for a few minutes to grab some coffee and pamphlets.

Where: This monthly event will be held at Family Violence Project's administrative office located at 83 Western Avenue on the corner of Drew Street in Augusta. There is a small parking lot in front of the building facing Drew Street, and a larger parking lot behind the building.
